Form will be returned to crew member subsequent to inward clearance for representation on departure, if crew member is not disembarking in Papua New Guinea.

NOTICE OF CAPTAINS AND CREWS OF AIRCRAFT

(Please read this notes before completing the reverse side)

Certain articles subject to Customs Control which may be in your possession must be declared on this form. Those articles include:

- TOBACCO AND TOBACCO PRODUCT, SPIRITIOUS LIQOURS, WINES, PERFUMERY PRODUCTS, RADIOS, RECORD PLAYERS, TAPE RECORDERS, CD/VCD/DVD PLAYERS, TV SETS SPORTING REQUITES, JEWELLERY, WATCHES, TEXTILE ARTICLES, FOOTWEAR AND OTHER GOODS.
- PROHIBITED IMPORTS – SUCH AS FIREARMS & AMMUNITION, DANGEROUS WEAPONS (Including spring bladed knives, daggers, bludgeons, coshes knuckle clusters and sword sticks, pornographic books and material etc.)
- DRUGS OF DEPENDENCE, for example NARCOTICS, HALLUCINOGENS, AMPHETAMINES, and BARBITURATES AND TRANQUILLISERS.

Note: Articles or goods subject to Customs Control **MUST NOT BE LANDED WITHOUT AUTHORITY**

Notes for the completion of this form:

- The form is required to be completed and signed by each crew member.
- THE CAPTAIN IS REQUIRED TO ENSURE THAT ALL CREW MEMBERS HAVE BEEN MADE FULLY AWARE OF REQUIREMENTS –WARNING: PENALTIES FOR DRUG OFFENCES IN PAPUA NEW GUINEA ARE SEVERE.
- Report all articles and goods subject to Customs Control in your possession or custody including those held or intended for someone else.
- Wearing apparel and other bona fide personnel effects of a general or trivial nature in use need not be declared
- State the QUANTITY, DESCRIPTION AND VALUE, (provide proof of payment) of goods held and the MAKERS NAME or BRAND and SERIAL NUMBER of radios, tape recorders, recorders, record players, CD/VCD/DVD/ players, watches, cameras, binoculars, typewriters, etc.
- If you have nothing declare, write NIL in the appropriate section of the form

The completed form is to be attached to the General Declaration and handed to the Customs Officer on arrival of the aircraft at the first port of call in Papua New Guinea.

Customs will retain all forms pertaining to crew of PNG Operated Aircraft and subsequent to clearance at the port of disembarkation, will return those to crew of foreign operated aircraft for re-presentation upon departure.

NOTE: Aircraft crews on International flights may be granted duty free allowance of liquor not exceeding two litres and tobacco products not exceeding 250 grams (250 cigarettes or 50 cigars shall be deemed equal to 250 grams weight) upon arrival into Papua New Guinea. Those concessions are granted to individual crew members once at an interval of not less than 30 days from the date the previous concession was granted. This allowance cannot be spread over a 30 day period.

QUARANTINE: In addition to Customs requirements the landing of plants, parts of plants, animals or parts of animals and food of any kind is subject to authority of the National Agriculture Quarantine Inspection Authority (NAQIA). The NAQIA Act provides that persons illegally importing articles subject to quarantine are liable to prosecutions and forfeiture of the goods.
